III. Title V Hispanic Serving Institution Grant Presentation led by Dr. Martinez

- A. Dr. Martinez is the Grant coordinator at APU (<u>rsmartinez@apu.edu</u>).
- B. This program awarded our school with 2.7 million dollars from Washington DC's academic fund. We were designated an HSI in 2017 which means over 25% of our students were Hispanic or Latinx. The designation opens the door for funding but does not guarantee it. We have just completed the 1st of a 5-year grant. This grant will benefit all students. Gina Garcia is a premiere HSI researcher. Our grant proposal was written based on her research. We should be about "servingness," how we service the students. In Fall 2021, APU's enrollment was 37% Hispanic,



over 30% White, and 32%

represented race/ethnicity. This grant has allowed for learning assistants, the summer bridge program, and Stellic.

C. There is work surrounding student success networks that still needs to be done.

Dr. Martinez would like SGA's help, ideas, and support for on-campus student resources. One potential option would be to have Kiosks around the university that would give students more information about programs on campus. A potential drawback is stand-alone kiosks may be seen as archaic. It may be better to create an app or partner with APU Now for these resources.
